





## EDUCATION

Everyone would agree that a good education system is paramount to a nation's success. With this in mind, ICNA Relief Canada continually invests in education and in school facility improvement throughout the developing world. In 2014, we spent more than \$380,000 for several crucial educational support and relief initiatives, mainly in Pakistan, India, and Bangladesh. Projects included the renovation and/or expansion of primary schools, post-secondary education scholarships, skill enhancement programs, provision of school supplies such as desks, uniforms, etc. and other financial support for schools serving the poorest children and adults from rural and slum areas; many of the

most destitute people benefitting from our projects live in regions and countries devastated by war or natural disasters.




ICNA Relief Canada realizes the importance of clean water in helping to build and maintain healthy, prosperous communities in the developing world. And so in 2014, we invested more than \$62,000 in 3 new water projects (one in India, two in Pakistan). They included the drilling and construction of 20 hand-operated water pumping stations in the Thar Desert of Pakistan, where severe famine and drought have caused a serious shortage of potable water, leading to an increase in disease. Another very successful clean water project helped provide thousands of primary school students and staff with safe and abundant drinking water facilities at 22 READ Foundation schools in rural AJK, Pakistan. In 2014, ICNA Relief Canada conducted awareness/fund-raising campaigns for several international disasters and helped support more than \$550,000 in Disaster and Emergency Relief projects, including:

- Violence in Central African Republic.
- Floods in Bosnia & Herzegovina.
- North Waziristan IDPs, Pakistan.
- Landslides in Badakshan Province, Afghanistan.
- Drought & Famine in Thar, Pakistan.
- Crisis in Gaza.
- South Asian Floods (Pakistan, Kashmir, India & Bangladesh).
- Civil Strife in Syria.



Of the \$550,000 spent on Disaster and Emergency Relief, ICNA Relief Canada invested more than \$100,000 to deliver emergency food aid and supplies to flood-affected populations of South Asia, and \$200,000 (plus \$100,000 for Fitra) to provide emergency food and non-food items in response to the ongoing crisis in Gaza.

About \$17,000 was also spent in providing emergency relief response to devastating floods in Bosnia-Herzegovina which inundated more than half the country during 2014. These funds were used to build 5 sizable greenhouses, and purchase 5 Rototillers for needy farmers that enabled them to cultivate food for personal and commercial use.


**Disbursements on Healthcare** 

In 2014, ICNA Relief Canada spent approximately \$10,000 to construct a Diagnostic Lab and Collection Centre in Tharparkar, Pakistan, where several years of failed rains have caused severe drought and famine, contributing to the spread of preventable, but often fatal diseases, such as pneumonia and diarrhea.

ICNA Relief Canada also invested more than \$1.15 million on several major health care projects in Pakistan, India, Bangladesh and Syria. These included funding for the construction and operation of full-fledged hospitals, clinics, mobile clinics, medical camps, diagnostic labs and ambulances in Pakistan, India and Bangladesh, plus the purchase and distribution of urgently needed medical supplies to charitable hospitals operating inside Syria.

## 🐨 GLOBAL ZABIHA

In 2014, ICNA Relief Canada successfully arranged nearly 5,000 Goat and/or Cow share orders totaling more than \$464,000 – an initiative that benefitted an estimated 500,000 needy people across 15 countries.

We also partnered via UNRWA USA to implement Zabiha / Udhiya / Qurbani for Palestinian Refugees in Gaza and Syria.

## 🛐 ZAKAT-UL-FITR (FITRA)

ICNA Relief Canada also spent \$131,346 on Ramadan Food and Eid Gift Distribution for the needy in Pakistan, India, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Burma, and Kenya (including the Dadaab Somali Refugee Camp), as well as in Canada. An additional \$100,000 was contributed via UNRWA (United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees) USA for the purchase of essential food items in response to the crisis in Gaza.

## SADAQAH & AQEEQA (goat/sheep sacrifice)

Each year, ICNA Relief Canada arranges to perform Sadaqa and Aqeeqa Goat and Sheep Sacrifices in India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Kenya, Syria, and the Refugee Camp in Lebanon. These projects provide an important and convenient service to Canadian benefactors who wish that the sacrificial meat be of benefit to the poor and needy, instead of consuming it themselves.

# **INTERNATIONAL VISITS**

The United Village Schools in Hyderabad, India

The ICNA Relief Canada team periodically visits our international project sites in order to monitor the progress of ongoings activities and share constructive feedback with our partners.

During 2014 and the first quarter of 2015, several members of our Management team, Board, and donor community travelled from Canada to visit various areas of Pakistan, India and Bangladesh and reported their findings.



### INDIA

Br. Syed M. Agha, who oversees our projects in Canada& India, visited our Partner project sites in India in January 2014 and again in February 2015. He visited the Al-Shifa Multi-specialty Hospital in New Delhi, the Ehsas Clinic in Old Delhi, the Hyderabad Institute of Excellence in Hyderabad, the United Village Schools in Hyderabad, and several other projects in cities such as Chennai, Mysore and Kolkata, India.

In 2014, Br. Agha was joined by Sr. Nafees Khan (now an ICNA Relief Canada Board member); Sr. Nafees Khan is a popular children's book author and an active GTA community leader.

## PAKISTAN

In March 2015, Br. Abid R. Mir who is Manager of our Orphan Sponsorship Program, visited some of our main partners in the capital city of Islamabad, Pakistan, to assess the program's current performance and future needs.

Also earlier this year, Br. M. Arif Jahangiri, Secretary General of ICNA Canada, visited some our partners in Karachi, Pakistan; he was very pleased to see the positive impact that our health project partnerships are having in the lives of under-privileged people there.

During February and March 2015, Br. Chaudhry Abdul Ghafoor, a long-time donor and recently appointed ICNA Relief Canada Ambassador, took time from his personal vacation in Pakistan to tour several of our partner project sites in and around the Punjab and Azad Kashmir regions. He returned to Canada in early April and was elated to brief the entire ICNA Relief Canada team at head office about his very satisfying and reassuring visits with our partners.

During his trip, Br. Ghafoor attended several ICNA Relief Canada-funded institutions and participated in events organized by some of our Pakistan partners, including READ Foundation, Al-Khidmat Foundation, and Helping Hand for Relief and Development. He was especially pleased to see the professionalism, vision, diversity and inclusiveness which were apparent in all of the partners, programs and projects he visited, especially the inclusive nature of our

Al-Falah Post-Secondary Education Scholarship Program, which is helping some 250 aspiring but impoverished Pakistani students of all faith backgrounds realize their dreams for a higher education.

## BANGLADESH

Br. Amir Uz Zaman, MGA and a former Board Member of ICNA Relief Canada, visited parts of Bangladesh early in 2015. During his personal visit there, he reported on projects that ICNA Relief Canada is helping to support via the Help and Knowledge Institute, Bangladesh, and also arranged for video clips and pictures of our activities there.

## **OTHER COUNTRIES**

Despite several attempts by ICNA Relief Canada's management and Board to organize visits into Gaza, Syria and Myanmar during 2014 to assess the current situation and monitor the impact of our recent contributions there, travels to these places could not be arranged, primarily due to logistical and security issues. ICNA Relief Canada continues to explore other possible avenues for safely visiting these countries during the remainder of 2015. As they become available, updates will be shared via our website and social media.

Alhamdulillah, and with help from brothers and sisters of our community, ICNA Relief Canada continues to improve in reporting from and monitoring our partners, as well as exploring further opportunities to assist needy and destitute people throughout the many countries in which we operate.

## RESOURCE CENTRES/FOOD BANKS

ICNA Relief Canada (IRC) operates Resource Centres / Food Banks in the following 10 Canadian cities - Brantford ON, Calgary AB, Edmonton AB, Milton ON, Mississauga ON, Montreal QC, Ottawa ON, Scaborough ON, Surrey BC, and Thorncliffe ON.

In 2014, ICNA Relief Canada added two new Resource Centre / Food Bank locations (Brantford and Montreal). Together, our 10 Food Banks served more than 36,000 individuals (or 9,900 families). With God's Mercy, this was made possible through generous support provided by the local communities (both financial and inkind donations) and the tireless hard work of our Resource Centre staffpeople and volunteers. Our Food Bank program operated on a combined budget of more than \$800,000, with our Ottawa and Thorncliffe locations topping the list for highest activity and greatest number of clients served. In addition to serving as Food Banks, ICNA Relief Canada's 10 Resource Centres also provided other much-needed services, including Individual and Family Counselling, Information Sessions, and Workshops on various topics such as Health and Wellness, and Parenting. ICNA Relief Centres also helped connect the community with our other domestic programs.

### **MUSLIM FAMILY SERVICES:**

Our Muslim Family Services department strives to preserve and strengthen Canadian Muslim families and their values. Initiatives from previous years were continued in 2014 with increased efforts focused on better organizing, documenting and enhancing the quality of services provided.

## 1. COUNSELLING SERVICES

Counselling Services were provided to more than 100 individuals and/or families across Canada and included the following major areas:

- Marital and Family
- Religious/ Spiritual care
- New Immigrants and Refugees
- Crisis Intervention
- Referrals to other Agencies and Resources
- Finding Employment / Jobs

## 👘 2.SENIORS' SUPPORT

Aging can create many challenges for our seniors, some of which increase their susceptibility to depression and other illnesses. Lack of attention and access to opportunities for healthy socialization can worsen many adverse situations for the elderly. The Seniors' Support program of ICNA Relief Canada aims to engage seniors in culturally inviting and inclusive environments. Programs held during 2014 included educational and entertainment gettogethers in Mississauga, Milton, Scarborough, Thorncliffe (all in Ontario) and Edmonton AB. Events such as 'Eid gatherings,



an annual picnic, a museum visit, computer training classes, and interactive intergenerational sessions for youth to connect and share experiences with valued elders were also organized. As before, we thank the ICNA Canada Sisters wing, whose members play an important role in arranging these programs.

In late 2014, ICNA Relief Canada's Mississauga location launched the new "Glen Erin Seniors" project, generously funded by the Ontario Seniors Secretariat. This initiative focuses on engaging and empowering local seniors through opportunities to serve as volunteers and mentors.

## 🖉 3. MATRIMONIAL SERVICES

Finding suitable marriage partners for Muslim youth in the West has become a major need and challenge for many immigrant families.

To alleviate this problem, ICNA Relief Canada's free matrimonial service works to make the matching process easier and less intimidating. Launched in July 2012, this initiative has been welcomed with great enthusiasm and is constantly evolving. Prospective candidates and/or their families are invited to register on the ICNA Relief Canada website and consult with our matrimonial services team.

Even in affluent times there are many who face great economic hardships and struggle to make ends meet. ## 💏 6. FOSTER PARENTING

Foster Parenting is a model whereby trained foster parents provide care to children in safe, nurturing, and healthy family environments when the children's own families are unable to do so for various reasons. ICNA Relief Canada's foster parenting initiative connects people interested in becoming foster parents with their local Children's Aid Society (CAS), as well as collaborating by organizing seminars and presentations to raise awareness and provide guidance on how to become a foster parent, especially within the Muslim community.

Of the 7 prospects referred to CAS in 2014, one has approached the final stage. She has been through the interview, assessment and training phases and is now in the home study phase.

# MARYAM HOME (Women's Shelter)

Maryam Home is to be a temporary safe shelter for women experiencing abuse and is the newest major local program initiative by ICNA Relief Canada. ICNA Relief Canada recently purchased the property in a stable and secure Mississauga middle-class neighborhood to create this place for women fleeing abusive relationships and who need a safe living environment. Maryam Home will welcome all women needing shelter but will seek primarily to help single Muslim women from the GTA who find themselves in abusive and/or threatening situations. This temporary residence will serve halal food and provide its female residents with a variety of culturally compatible counselling and wellness services. Qualified caregivers and staff will help them return to living normal, respected and dignified lives.

ICNA Relief Canada purchased the Mississauga property for Maryam Home at a cost of approximately \$777,000 and urgently requires your help to renovate, furnish, and staff the facility so that we can begin providing services before mid-2015.


