Surian refugee sponsorship and youth leadership and development programs (YLDP). 




PERCENTAGE OF NON-PROGRAM EXPENSES

DISASTER & **EMERGENCY RELIEF**

In 2015, ICNA Relief Canada conducted awareness & fund-raisina campaians for several international disasters and helped support over \$690,000 in Disaster and Emergency Relief projects, including:

- Gaza Crisis, Palestine
- South Asian Floods
- Civil Strife in Syria
- Nepal Earthquake
- Burma Crisis

Of the total spent on Disaster and Emergency Relief, ICNA Relief Canada invested over \$190,000 to deliver emergency aid and supplies for Gaza, and over \$237,000 to provide emergency food, shelter, and basic necessities in response to the Burma Crisis.

Around \$90.000 were also spent in providing Emergency Relief response to the devastating earthquake in Nepal. Furthermore, our delegation from Canada also personally visited Nepal, Burma, and the Turkish-Syrian border amidst the crises to participate in relief activities.

1 HEALTHCARE

ICNA Relief Canada provides many healthcare facilities and services worldwide. We help build hospitals, sponsor hospital operations, help setup emergency medical clinics in disaster zones and more.

In 2015. ICNA Relief Canada invested over \$ 330.000 on several major healthcare projects in Pakistan and Syria. These included funding for the construction and operation of full-fledged hospitals, clinics, mobile clinics, medical camps, diagnostic labs and ambulances.

Each year, ICNA Relief Canada arranges to perform Sadaga and Ageega Goat and/or Sheep Sacrifices in India, Pakistan, Bangladesh and Kenya. These projects provide an important and convenient service to Canadian benefactors who wish that the sacrificial meat be of benefit to the less privileged, instead of consuming it themselves. In 2015, we spent over \$54,000 on this project performing it in 5 countries.



WATER FOR LIFE

ICNA Relief Canada realizes the importance of clean water in helping to build and maintain healthy, prosperous communities in the developing world. In 2015, we invested more than \$160,000 on a few water projects including the drilling and construction of 100 hand-operated Community Water Pumps in remote villages across the Thar Desert of Pakistan as well as a clean water project which helped provide thousands of primary school students and staff with safe and abundant drinking water facilities at 22 Rural area schools in the Azad Jammu & Kashmir of Pakistan.

MEMBERS OF ICNA RELIEF CANADA'S TEAM PERIODICALLY VISIT OUR INTERNATIONAL PROJECT SITES IN ORDER TO MONITOR THE PROGRESS OF ONGOING ACTIVITIES AND SHARE CONSTRUCTIVE FEEDBACK WITH OUR PARTNERS.

During 2015, some members of our Management, our Board of Directors, ICNA Canada's Governing Body, as well as our Donors travelled from Canada to visit various areas of Pakistan, India, Nepal, Turkey, Burma, Indonesia, and Bangladesh to monitor, report and participate in our work.

India

Br. Syed M. Agha, who oversees our projects

in Canada & India, visited our Partner project sites in India in February 2015. He visited the Al-Shifa Multi-specialty Hospital in New Delhi, the Ehsas Clinic in Old Delhi, the Hyderabad Institute of Excellence in Hyderabad, the United Village Schools in Hyderabad, and several other projects in cities such as Chennai, Mysore and Kolkata, India.

Pakistan

In March 2015, Br. Abid R. Mir, manager of our Orphan Sponsorship Program, visited some of our main partners in the capital city of Islamabad, Pakistan, to assess the program's current performance and future needs.

Also in early 2015, Br. M. Arif Jahangiri,

Former Secretary General of ICNA Canada, visited some of our partners in Karachi, Pakistan; he was very pleased to see the positive impact that our health project partnerships are having in the lives of the under-privileged people there.

During February and March 2015, Br. Abdul Ghafoor Chaudhry, a long-time donor and our Ambassador, took time from his personal vacation in Pakistan to tour several of our partner project sites in and around the Punjab and Azad Kashmir regions.

In August, our Executive Director Br. Shaukat Hussain and our former chairperson Br. Yahya Mansoori visited several of our projects across Pakistan. Some of the places they visited included Hospitals in Mardan, Rawalpindi, Talagana & Karachi all projects

being constructed / managed by our partner AlKhidmat Foundation Pakistan with our financial support. They also visited AlKhidmat's Orphanage projects in Peshawar & Murree, and some of the Community Water Well project locations in Tharparkar which ICNA Relief Canada's generous donors helped to sponsor; Also among sites visited were AlKhidmat's Blood Banks & Schools in Punjab and Sindh provinces. The team later met with our other local partner officials and many orphan children in different areas that ICNA Relief Canada helps to support. Next, Brothers Yahya and Shaukat attended an Orphans' Gettogether Program in Rawalpindi which was organized by one of our partners - Help in Need, Pakistan. Thereafter they met with some of AlKhidmat's Al-Falah Post-Secondary Education Scholarship Program beneficiaries in Lahore whom ICNA Relief Canada helps to support financially. These Higher Education Scholarships are granted to some of the brightest but financially deserving as well as needy orphan students across Pakistan.

During a visit to our partner - Ghazali Education Trust's schools, the team distributed Hygiene Kits among students who mostly came from needy families. Additionally, Brothers Shaukat and Yahya visited AlKhidmat Foundation's relief camp for the flood affected people of Chitral, KPK and

partook in relief activities there.

As their last stop, they visited a 300 year old community of poor fishermen at Rehri Goth in Karachi. They found these people to be seriously deprived of some of the most basic necessities of life. The team identified some urgent needs of this community and is working on a plan to provide them with education, clean water, healthcare, food and hygiene awareness and supplies.

Nepal

In May 2015, ICNA Relief Canada's delegation consisting of Br. Shaukat Hussain (Executive Director) and Br. Tahir Alvi (ICNA Relief Canada's Board Member) visited Nepal. The purpose of their visit was to monitor the relief activities and aid being provided to the victims of the severe earthquakes that had struck there only a few weeks prior. ICNA Relief Canada's response team was one of the very first relief teams to arrive and provide aid to a small remote village near Mount Everest at the Indian border. The inhabitants of the area called Bahadurkali, District Sindhuli, a 7.5 hour drive from the capital city of Kathmandu, were provided Emergency Relief Supplies including Food & Medical Care by ICNA's team. The local minister, army, and police warmly welcomed our team to the region and provided security and support throughout the entire trip.





Syria & Turkey

Our delegation team consisting of Executive Director Br. Shaukat Hussain and ICNA Relief Canada Committee Board Member Br. Tahir Alvi also visited Turkey in May 2015. The purpose of the visit was to assess and address the needs of Syrian refugees inside Turkey. They visited various schools at Kumlu and Kirikhan Towns and identified that more educational projects were needed to secure the refugee children's futures. The also visited the border crossing points with the Syrian district of Reyhanli where they helped load a cargo van full of food boxes for Syrians. They also visited a hospital facility where they met numerous patients in rehabilitation. They found that there is a great need for supporting hospitals and medical rehabilitation centres within Turkey as well as inside Syria.

Burma & Indonesia

A two-person delegation from ICNA Relief Canada, Consisting of Br. Shaukat Hussain, Executive Director, and Br. Tahir Alvi. an ICNA Relief Canada Committee Board Member, visited Burma and Indonesia in July of 2015. The purpose of their visit was to meet with our regional relief partners from Indonesia who were working on the ground in Burma. They also reviewed the latest progress of our various relief projects that we helped to finance and partake in 2015's Ramadan Relief Program for the Rohingya Muslims inside Burma. They also assessed the various needs of the Rohingya Refugees in Burma, Indonesia and Malaysia to make plans and arrangements for new projects to help them in future.

Alhamdulillah, and with the help from members of our community, ICNA Relief Canada continues to improve in reporting from and monitoring our partners, as well as exploring further opportunities to assist needy and destitute people throughout the many countries in which we operate.

The Food Bank is an essential component of all of our Resource Centres. In 2015, our 10 Food Banks served more than 65.000 individuals (or close to 17.000 families)! With Allah's Mercy, this was made possible through generous support provided by the local communities (both financial and inkind donations) and the tireless hard work of our Resource Centre staff and volunteers. Our combined Food Bank program operated on a budget of around \$1,000,000, with our Ottawa and Thorncliffe locations once again topping the list for highest activity and greatest number of clients served. In addition to Food Banks, some of our Resource Centers also provided other much-needed services through the following 8 programs: Muslim Family Services (MFS), Seniors' Support, Matrimonial Services, Funeral Support, Foster Parenting, Domestic Zakat Program and Youth Leadership Development Program (YLDP).

MUSLIM FAMILY SERVICES

Our Muslim Family Services (MFS) department strives to preserve and strengthen Canadian Muslim families and their values. Initiatives from previous uears were continued in 2015 with increased efforts focused on organizing, documenting enhancing the quality of services provided.

COUNSELLING SERVICES

Counselling Services were provided to more than 130 families across Canada and included the following major areas:

> Marital and Family Religious/Spiritual care New Immigrants and Refugees Crisis Intervention Referrals to other Agencies and Resources Finding Employment / Jobs

SENIORS' SUPPORT

Lack of attention and access to healthu socialization opportunities can have an adverse effect for the elderly. The Seniors' Support Program of ICNA Relief Canada aims to engage seniors in a culturally inviting and inclusive environment. Programs held during 2015 included educational and entertainment get-togethers in Mississauga, Milton, Scarborough, Thorncliffe (all in Ontario) and Edmonton, Alberta. Events such as workshops, 'Eid gatherings, an Annual Picnic, Outings, a Seniors Recognition Ceremony, Computer Training Classes, and Interactive Intergenerational Sessions for youth to connect and share experiences with valued

elders were organized. Special thank goes to the ICNA Canada's Sisters' Wing, whose members played an important role in arranging these programs.

In April 2015, ICNA Relief Canada's Mississauga location successfully completed a one year long "Glen Erin Seniors" project, which was funded by the Ontario Seniors Secretariat. This initiative focused on engaging and empowering local seniors through opportunities to serve as volunteers and mentors.



MATRIMONIAL SERVICES

Finding suitable marriage partners for Muslim uouth in the West has become a major need and challenge for many immigrant families.

To address this problem, ICNA Relief Canada's free matrimonial services team works to make the matching process easier and less intimidating. Launched in July 2012, this initiative has been welcomed with great enthusiasm and is constantly evolving. Prospective candidates and/or their families are invited to register on the ICNA Relief Canada website and consult with our matrimonial services team.

In 2015, ICNA Relief Canada organized several sold-out social events and educational seminars on marriage, where individuals and families learned more about the Islamic perspective on marriage and were able to make positive connections. Over 200 new families registered for our Matrimonial Service and two marital matches were made. Many people received premartial counselling.

📑 FUNERAL SUPPORT FUND

Today, the cost of purchasing a grave plot, and even the most modest funeral arrangements for a departed loved one can often reach into thousands of dollars. For manu, these expenses are simply unaffordable and they are forced to rely on friends, family, and community members for financial help. To alleviate this problem, ICNA Relief Canada has established a Funeral (Janaza) Support Fund to assist needu families in covering some of the costs related to funerals for deceased loved ones. In 2015, ICNA Relief Canada assisted 8 needy families locally.



FOSTER PARENTING

Foster Parenting is a model through which foster parents provide care to children in safe, nurturing, and healthy family environments when a child's own family is unable to do so for any reason. ICNA Relief Canada's foster parenting initiative connects people interested in becoming foster parents with their local Children's Aid Society (CAS), as well as collaborating by organizing seminars and presentations to raise awareness and provide guidance on how to become a foster parent, especially within the Muslim community.

Of the seven prospects referred to CAS during 2015, one parent has completed her training and is soon to become a foster parent!



DOMESTIC ZAKAT PROGRAM (EMERGENCY FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE)

Even in affluent times there are many who face great economic hardships and struggle to make ends meet. Each year, ICNA Relief Canada receives and carefully assesses countless applications for financial assistance and tries to provide a small, one-time amount of monetary relief (from our General Zakat Fund) aimed at alleviating a family's financial burden during dire situations. During 2015, ICNA Relief Canada provided financial assistance to 50 families within Canada, totaling about \$38,850 from our Zakat Fund.



↑ ↑ • YOUTH LEADERSHIP **DEVELOPMENT** PROGRAM (YLDP)

Each summer, our YLDP program helps impart valuable skills to high school students through a creative "learning while doing" approach. Consisting of seminars and exciting field projects in the areas of Personal Development, Organization, Communication, Community Activism and Social Development, this summertime weekend only program was offered in Mississauga and Thorncliffe, Ontario. Over 100 students participated and graduated from the program. For Ontario students, the YLDP experience also counts toward fulfilling part of the 40 volunteer hours required towards completing their secondary school diploma.

Maryam Home is to be a temporary safe shelter for women experiencing abuse. In 2015, ICNA Relief Canada purchased the property in a stable and secure middle-class neighborhood in the west GTA region to create a space for women fleeing abusive relationships and looking for a safe living environment. Once operational, Maryam Home will welcome all women needing shelter but will seek primarily to help single Muslim women from the GTA who find themselves in abusive and/or threatening situations. This temporary residence will serve halal food and provide its female residents with a variety of culturally compatible counselling and wellness services. Qualified counsellors, caregivers and staff will help them return to living normal, respected and dignified lives.



The Canadian government announced its temporary public policy dated September 19, 2015 to address the current Syrian refugee crisis and allowed entry to 10,000 Syrian Refugees under the Privately Sponsorship of Refugees (PSR) Scheme. ICNA Relief made the announcement to bring to Canada 100 Syrian Refugee Families under the PSR Scheme.

ICNA Relief Canada entered into a collaboration agreement as a Constituent Group with



the Islamic Foundation of Toronto (IFT) in December 2015, to carry out this sponsorship activity. Soon after signing the agreement with IFT. ICNA Relief Canada started to process the Syrian Refugee applications for Sponsorship with 60 Syrian Refugee applications processed so far. Alhamdulillah, we have already welcomed 9 of our sponsored refugee families in Canada.

IRC has made a structured plan for their resettlement in Canada. This plan is being followed and reports are being obtained about their settlement status. These families are settling in well in Canada. A dedicated orientation session was organized one month after their arrival. This session was designed to provide them with all the necessary information and orientation about common laws and regulations. Applications for all of the necessary documents were made within the first month of the families' arrival. We are expecting to receive the rest of our sponsored Syrian families very soon. After their initial settlement, the focus is to make them self-sufficient by linking them to

the professionals in the area of their interest and capabilities.


Future Plans:
